The much-awaited opening of CMC Vellore Ranipet campus was the highlight of 2022. Thiru M.K Stalin, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu inaugurated the new hospital on 25th June. Plans for this campus began when all space in the Vellore Town campus (Main campus) was put to best use and there was no more scope for expansion. Construction began in December 2016 and the additional surge space was a blessing during the pandemic. Multiple teams worked tirelessly to see this project to a successful completion. Today, four magnificent buildings of Ranipet Campus stand tall, enveloped by mountains in the back and lush green fields in the front.

In August, the facilities were opened to patients needing diagnostic services like CT & MRI scans. Now there are 16 speciality departments offering services in the new campus. The Advanced Level-1 Trauma Care Centre was dedicated on the 3rd November. Our multi-disciplinary teams from Emergency Medicine, Trauma Surgery, Orthopaedics, Neurosurgery, Dental and others work together to save lives. The Golden Hour Fund and other charitable schemes are in place for accident victims and poor patients unable to afford treatment.

Focusing on Hope

The Emergency Fund provides grants for treatment of over 150 poor patients from all over the country. It aims to be flexible and responsive to need, helping people like Basu & his wife Ganga (names changed). They are a special couple from West Bengal. Both of them are vision impaired.

Ganga tells their story:

Basu was born blind and is on treatment for mental health disorders. My family sent me to a blind school in Kolkata, 200 km away from our village. I learnt braille, did well in my studies and participated in sports. I got a job as a history teacher in the Govt Girls High School in our village. I told my family that I want to marry Basu since he is blind like me. Our families supported this match and we are happily married. Our teenage son is now studying in 12th grade.

Unfortunately, my husband was diagnosed with colon cancer. His older brother was cured of cancer after treatment in CMC some years ago, so I decided that our best chance is to come to Vellore. The long train journey was daunting, but the father of one of my students accompanied us.

At CMC, Basu was admitted under the Department of General Surgery. The cancer had not spread much and the doctors operated successfully. He was treated for other complications by the Departments of Psychiatry & Endocrinology. Every step of the way,

someone would help us - doctors, nurses, staff and other patients. They gave us hope!

'Siloam' is a collaborative effort between CMC and generous friends - VCMC Foundation, Friends of Vellore - UK & Australia and CBM. The Mobile Eye Clinic takes expert eye doctors to the doorsteps of communities around CHAD, Jawadhi hills and Chittoor to treat patients and restore sight. Regular screening and appropriate intervention can prevent blindness, transforming life for our patients. The van is equipped to give retinal laser treatment. Since June, 568 patients have been screened and treated in the Mobile Van. Siloam means 'sent' and is the pool near Jerusalem where Jesus healed a blind man.

Person-to-Person (PTP) campaign

In February 2022, CMC participated in a 60-day Fundraising Challenge on the giveindia.org portal. We reached out to enthusiastic fundraising champions, staff and students, who started their own 'supporting fundraisers' for the PTP fund. To help 500 patients through PTP, we needed ₹30 lakhs. First Surgical Robot in CMC

The **Da Vinci Xi Surgical Robot** enables surgeons perform delicate, complex operations through a few small incisions. Since June, over 50 Robotic-assisted surgeries were done for

urology, colorectal, upper GI surgery & gynecology.

The initiation of the robotic programme will help CMC provide a cost-efficient and high-volume robotic service.
